## **Additional information on Brussels for international participants**

### **Participants are expected to arrange their own travel and accommodation.**

- Inside Brussels International Airport at Zaventem, there is a railway station (termed “Zaventem (Airport)”), with frequent direct trains (about 4 trains per hour) to the Brussels Central train station (termed “Brussel-Centraal” or “Bruxelles-Central”).
- Brussels can also be easily reached by train from London (via Eurostar trains), from Paris, Köln and Amsterdam (via Thalys trains) or from other near-by European cities. Such international trains will typically stop in all the major train stations in Brussels, including the Brussels Central station. In any way, all the trains going into Brussels will stop in the Brussels South (Brussel-Zuid/Bruxelles-Midi) train station and there are frequent trains connecting Brussels South to Brussels Central.
